HOW MANY TO ORDER

Counting up your invitation needs is as easy as 1–2–3. First, go through your guest list, and count one invitation per family/couple/single person. (Don't forget that children over 16 get their own invitations.) Second, add invitations for the officiant, for both sets of parents, and for the attendants. Third, figure in some extras—for keepsakes, mistakes, and last-minute invitations.
